

This is a great review of Skloot's book, "The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks." Skloot follows the issue of Henrietta Lacks and her cancer cells, known in the science community as HeLa cells, and where ownership and consent lie. Lacks's family found out later about how her cells were being used for research, and felt betrayed. Did the doctors and researchers cross an ethical line by taking Lacks's cells and not asking for consent? The analysis of this book is thorough, exploring the issues and dilemmas of the scientific community, who have benefited enormously from HeLa cells. Quite simply, the amount of research done because HeLa cells are immortal, have dramatically changed our lives. But even with these benefits, what role do ethics play? This review asks and answers questions like this. I recommend this review because of its depth and its analysis. It does a better job of looking into these questions than the original book.

It's very interesting to know where many medical terms, diagnostics and treatments originate from. I had never heard of the HELA cells but this analysis quickly captivated me and prompted me to do a

little research and now I am hooked and want to learn more about Henrietta Lacks and her immortal life.
