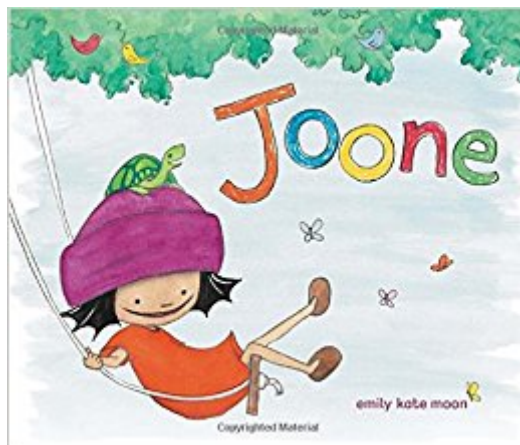

PreS-Gr 1-A sweet, gentle narrative about a child who is being raised by her grandfather. The text, which celebrates the small things in life that a child might appreciate, reads smoothly and is written with some flair; but with very little plot, it lacks a real hook for a young audience. Joone's solo swim does add some humor and adventure, but it may be hard to explain, within a realistic story, that Grandpa is absent in this scene. The bucolic setting, Joone's home (a yurt on the banks of a small body of water with a tree house in the backyard), and the mood (quiet and loving) are more central to the book than the action. Moon shows promise, not only as a picture-book writer, but as an

illustrator as well. The gouache and pencil illustrations are bright, colorful, and full of interesting detail. Rather than a book to read to groups, Joone is best suited for sharing one-on-one.-Maralita L. Freeny, District of Columbia Public Library

Some years ago I rented a furnished condo for a weekend in Austin from a struggling young artist who let her condo out now and then to make ends meet. The condo was decorated with many pieces of the artist's beautiful, uplifting and highly original artwork, in various stages of completion. Although I did not know it, I was viewing Joone in progress. I purchased the book for my neighbors' little boys (2 and 4 year olds), and had the pleasure of watching as their mom read it to them for the first time. They loved it, and so did their mom! The artwork is beautiful, and the characters (Joone, her grandfather, and her pet turtle, who live together in a very nice yurt) will soon be favorites. Joone is surely destined to become a must-have children's classic.

I am always looking for something new to read with my 3 year old son. A friend told me about Joone

and I am glad I listened and purchased this book. He loves finding different things on each page and the repeating themes. It is set up great for practice counting and color identification. So not only is the story very nice and fun to follow but it can be used as a learning tool in many ways. Moon has done a wonderful job with the illustrations and creating a children's story for the ages...all ages. I have an 8 month old girl too and I am certain this will be a favorite once she is ready for books.

Joone may not be the perfect little girl, but her whimsical and loving nature bring the purity of intent into all her adventures. Grandpa is her hero and Dr. Chin her constant companion in an unconventional world that includes a beautiful home in a yurt and a playground in a tree. Miss Moon's artwork is captivating, and you and your children will spend much time discovering so many story details hidden in the pictures. This is a must-have storybook, especially for our children growing up in a building-bound digital world, to share the joys of living simply and embracing the natural world.

Joone is the free-spirited, honest, playful, loving, whimsical, and curious kid who will remind adult readers of all they once were and all they imagine themselves still-to-be in an ideal existence. Oh, right--this is a book for kids! It certainly is, and it will delight and inspire a gazillion requests to read and re-read again and again, and you won't mind doing so, not a bit. Joone had me and my kids at "hello". She's sure to capture your heart, as she has the many kids (and their grown-ups) to whom I've gifted this book. It's a treasure. The illustrations in this book are charming, irreverent, beautiful. Spoiler alert: the happiness in this book is infectious. My children loved this book, laughing as they turned every page.
