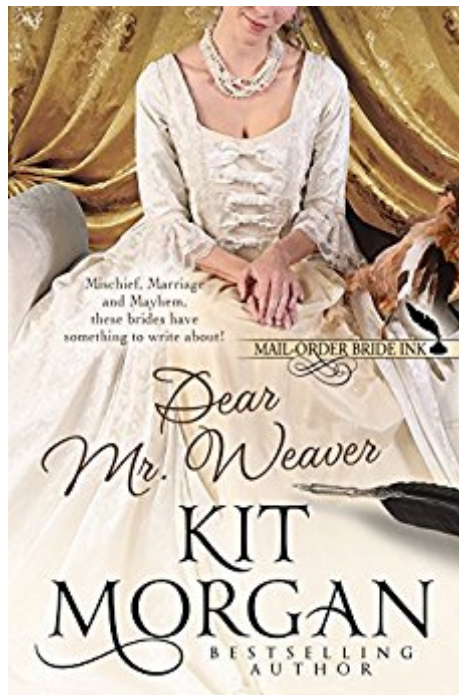

Ebba decides to become a mail-order-bride to escape a life of drudgery. She answers a letter from Daniel. Instead of mailing the letter herself, she hands it to Mrs. Pettigrew, who arranged these marriages. Mrs. Pettigrew is an eccentric woman with some unusual ideas. Unbeknownst to Ebba, she adds a line to Ebba's letter before sealing it and mailing it. When that letter falls into the hands of the town gossip in the town near where Daniel lives, Ebba's troubles begin. This is a cute story. Ebba's character is well developed, but Daniel's is not in my opinion. The two main characters are seldom together in most of the book. The romance is not well developed either. After the wedding, you find out they enjoy being intimate, but when do they fall in love? They never actually say "I love you" to each other. I like this author, but this is not one of her best stories.

Ebba is alone in the world, so decides she will see Mrs. Pettigrew about being a mail order bride. The letter she writes about herself answers Daniel's questions, short & to the point. But quirky Mrs. P decides the letter needs something to give it some oomph! What she wrote shocked Matt, Daniel's cousin, who read the letter to Daniel cause he was too nervous to read it himself. But he was so flabbergasted over what the PS said, he couldn't read it to Daniel. They write back, sending for her, but both failed to realize her letter was stolen by the worst person possible! So when Ebba comes to town, everyone is looking at her funny, some with outright disdain towards her. Coming from a very small & not a close family, Ebba is overwhelmed to find out that Daniel is the youngest son of a very large family (24 family members live on the ranch & are very close). And worse than

finding out he left out a few key details, she finds her allergies are the worst they have ever been! How can she be the wife of a farmer? Daniel is happy with his choice of brides. He knows the town folks act a bit strange towards her, but not until after the wedding, during the meal, does he find out why. He's furious! Something bad happens, of course. They all end up in court because of it. Oh, the judge! The poor man! I laughed so hard! I so enjoyed this wonderful book! BTW, it was sweet & clean, no sex or language. I giggled quite a bit through it!

I have loved all of Kit Morgan's stories and she never disappoints. She is funny and witty and so funny at times, with very complex characters and lots of adventure. This is a new series but also ending with mail order bride for the last Weaver from Morgan's popular Mail Order Brides series. I love how she ended on series with the last man in one very big family now and starts a new series at the same time. I loved this story as I have all others. Again this is a must read and I highly recommend it. I do however recommend you starting with the first Mail Order Bride series to get background of the three towns that mail order brides have gone to. It will also give you the characters of Nowhere, Washington Territory, one of the three towns that get mail order brides. You will love the all the stories but at least read the ones that involve Nowhere then you can get the gist of the town and the people living there.

I enjoyed this story. It started out with Ms. Pettigrew, the matchmaker interviewing a girl to be her assistant. She tells her Ebba and Daniel Weaver's mail order bride story. Ebba agrees to go to Nowhere to be Daniel's mail order bride. She has no family and is in a bad job situation. She has no idea what she has gotten herself into. The Weavers are a family like no other! Daniel was ready to marry so he has his cousin write the letter to Ms. Pettigrew's agency. He is excited to meet Ebba and start his married life. There are certain things that were left out of his initial letter. This book is full of humor and will keep you reading to see what happens next. If you like good and clean romance then give it a try.

I liked this novel, it was an interesting and fast read; however, there was way more sexual content than I am comfortable reading. Now, I am not a prude, I just try to limit myself to what I am exposed to on a daily basis. I try to not read anything I wouldn't read out loud in front of my children. To place it in perspective, this novel did not go into specific details about what transpires between a man and woman in their bedroom; however, the story line did follow an added note to a letter that had everything to do with that subject. I have multiple books about mail-order brides, and in each the

authors tried to make it sound like something it wasn't, but I can say with certainty that that did not happen in this novel. The author was utterly honest about how small towns work, and the horrors of what one well placed gossip can cause. Overall, without the added things, this novel was good.

This story has a feeling of humor throughout. It is a great set-up to the series as the matchmaker is telling the story to a new hire. I definitely love the concept ideas, but I just felt so bad for the main character. By no fault of her own - and all fault of the matchmaker - she was faced with so many trials. She has a severe allergy to hay and pollen yet was sent to a farming community. She wrote her own letter, but the matchmaker added a postscript that caused a gossip to slander her name around town. It was a tad frustrating, but I loved the characters and their bonds of friendship and family ties. I'd definitely look into reading more by this author.

Fast clean read with appealing story line. Likable hero and heroine. Will definitely check out other books written by Kit Morgan. **BOTTOM LINE:** appealing and clean

The huge Weaver family was certainly a huge surprise to the innocent bride to be. They seemed to come from everywhere on the farm! Having lost her family, this family living life in a small orchard seemed so organized and in control.
