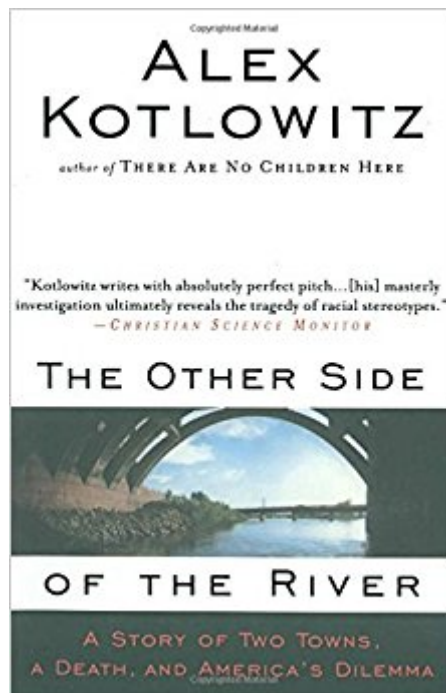




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The Other Side Of The River: A Story Of Two Towns, A Death, And America's Dilemma



Synopsis

Bestselling author Alex Kotlowitz is one of this country's foremost writers on the ever explosive issue of race. In *The Other Side of the River*, Kotlowitz takes us to two towns in southern Michigan, St. Joseph and Benton Harbor, separated by the St. Joseph River. Geographically close, but worlds apart, they are a living metaphor for America's racial divisions: St. Joseph is a prosperous lakeshore community and ninety-five percent white, while Benton Harbor is impoverished and ninety-two percent black. When the body of a black teenaged boy from Benton Harbor is found in the river, unhealed wounds and suspicions between the two towns' populations surface as well. The investigation into the young man's death becomes, inevitably, a screen on which each town projects their resentments and fears. *The Other Side of the River* sensitively portrays the lives and hopes of the towns' citizens as they wrestle with this mystery--and reveals the attitudes and misperceptions that undermine race relations throughout America.

Alex Kotlowitz' book shines a light on race relations in America by focusing on an incident that happened to a young man found floating in a river between two towns, one predominantly white and one predominantly black. The mystery of what happened to Eric is never resolved, but the different ways in which each town interprets his death illustrate the different experience the two races have in America. Thought provoking and smart, this book can be frustrating to read, but is still worthwhile.
