

Spending the summer in Maine I wanted to get a handle on the local flora and sent for this guide. The organization of images in this book by color, petal characteristics and leaf habit makes it work like a charm for speedy IDs. The photos are gorgeous; the text from contents to index was very well written and useful for amateurs (I'll leave professionals to speak for themselves). If I were pressed to find any fault at all, I'd have to say that flowers on the red, pink, blue continuum were assigned in a somewhat puzzling manner.
