

WW II German POW in Canada.

It is not often you read of German POWs; usually moved to camps in North America after interrogation, where they labored until the war ended. Priebke only spends 16 pages relating his Me 109 missions over England. A leader of a staffel in JG 77, they met Spitfires and his coolant system was damaged. After parachuting out, wounds bandaged, he was de-briefed and held. He expected to be released after England's surrender- such confidence! The second part of the book tells of sailing to Canada, confinement in camps and men he meets there. Escape is tried by some, notably Franz von Werra, who returned to Germany and died in service. For one reason or another, the remainder stick it out. Interspersed here are recollections of fighting in the Condor Legion, and pictures of men and planes they flew. The last part of the book is a paen to life in Canada after the war. He marries, represents Lufthansa in Toronto, meets celebrities, and forms friendships with other German immigrants.
