

I read the sports pages growing up. The sum of knowledge I had on Billy Martin was very limited, and mostly negative. I did see him have success with the Yankees, as well. I chose to read this book because he was a baseball figure from my childhood, and because I was negatively pre-disposed to him. I was certain that there had to be some good in there somewhere. There was and there wasn't. The book is so thorough, it is almost unbelievable. I was not looking to validate my opinion of him, nor to disprove it. I was looking to understand Billy Martin. He is very complicated to me. His story is so interesting both inside and outside of baseball. I found myself rooting for him in much of the book. His decisions related to baseball were terrific. His instincts and his will to win are undeniable. In his personal life he was both generous and selfish, if that is possible. In the end, I am glad I took the time to read this book (and it is long). I have a much greater understanding and appreciation for Billy Martin having read it. Bill Pennington did an enormous amount of research for this book and the

detail is amazing. He chose a great figure to document. If you appreciate baseball from Martin's era, both playing and managing, you will appreciate this book.

I thought that the author, Bill Pennington did a solid job of incorporating all 3 of the following in his book: the positives of both Billy Martin the baseball player as well as the long-time winning manager, and his somewhat flawed personality. Not being old enough to recall Martin as a Yankee Player allowed this book to provide me with some excellent info about his playing days. When growing up in the 50's, I was well aware of Billy as a "second baseman" for the Yankees, and as a Yankee fan in the 70's, obviously aware of the "manager" but I never knew the details of his life. This is a must-read for all sports fans, Mr. Pennington has done fabulous research through current and older interviews; not one of those authors who puts words in the subject's mouth. I lost a few hours of sleep because of this book - because I didn't want to put it down and go to bed. It reads very well, provides the right amount of detail, but does not bog down in boring details. I am not a baseball fan, but I grew up in the 80s and can remember all the players and key figures in the book. You do not need to be a baseball fan at all to enjoy this book. Billy Martin was a baseball genius, but he was an alcoholic. The latter overshadowed his accomplishments and eventually killed him.
