

She holds a Bachelors of Science in Nursing (BScN) and a Masters of Business Administration (MBA), and has worked in community health for over 40 years. She was also a marathon runner, completing her last marathon a few months before being diagnosed with MS (Multiple Sclerosis).

Since 1989, she has travelled in a wheelchair to more than 100 countries, touching every continent. Linda is an accessibility advocate, a motivational speaker and a writer who encourages all to embrace their dreams.

Working in community health when she was diagnosed with MS in 1983, home care nurse Linda McGowan realized, “I only had two choices. One was to sit at home, moan, groan, and complain that life was not fair. The second option was to take the skills and strengths that I had and do the best that I could with them” (Travelling the World with MS in a Wheelchair, page 7). She purchased a wheelchair and set out to travel the Great Wall of China to fulfill a life-long ambition, disability or not, the beginning of many such adventures. I am full of admiration.
