

I downloaded this book hoping for a comprehensive guide to the Shenandoah Valley but found it to be lacking in several areas. A significant portion of this book is simply the history and geography of the entire state of Virginia, which might be helpful if you've never been there, but I was hoping for more descriptive details about the Shenandoah Valley region. There are copious listings for attractions/restaurants/lodgings in the SV, but the descriptions are brief and highly generic, such that it would be difficult to discern which of these places are actually worth visiting. Furthermore, very few descriptions contained website addresses for the listings. All had phone numbers, which is necessary but a little antiquated when used in place of web addresses. I never pick up a phone when planning a vacation. Lastly, there were almost no mentions of handicapped accessibility, family-friendliness or other pertinent info that travelers are seeking. Skip this book and look elsewhere.
