

I don't know how he does it but I feel connected to his characters right from the start; they all feel so real, so genuine, with all the good and the bad stuff, with all their struggles, which in a way are all of our struggles to ultimately achieve the same: find a place where we truly belong, among people who truly care for us and we care for. After reading his first book, I knew I needed a big box of tissue nearby. I loved especially the relationship between Sal and his dad- and the many wonderful

secondary characters: dad of course, and Mima and Fito - I wanted to cry each time Fito turned up, my heart ached for him so much. He had been dealt such a tough card and yet he had so much decency, was such a good guy. I wanted life to be good to him, he deserved it. I highlighted many, many beautiful passages in the book.

I will make this review the briefest possible as I could write a book about this book. I really feel all the love all BenjamÃfÃ- n's characters and the portrayal of a Mexican-American family is really relevant to the times we are living. The characters are flawed and that is why this book is amazing. "Relatable" is a word grossly over used these times but I will use it as the Word Of The Review. I really enjoy reading about El Paso, Tx and JuÃfÃ'Ã rez as it is my hometown and the details about locations taken back there.

Saenz does it again! This book was as enjoyable as Aristotle and Dante, and as insightful as "He forgot to say Goodbye". This revolves around Sal, adopted son of a Gay Man living in El Paso (Where all of Saenz's books are set), as he embarks on a mission to figure out exactly who he is.

I was re-reading "Aristotle and Dante Discover the Secrets of the Universe" and decided to see if there was anything else he wrote out there for my kindle. So glad I did. If you loved "Aristotle and Dante", I think you will feel the same about this story. Maybe 4.5 stars instead of 5, but I decided to round up instead of down.

I liked this book a lot as a quick read, but if I could go back, I probably wouldn't spend 10 dollars on it. I'm a big reader and have read a lot of YA novels. This one was a solid "like." I enjoyed the plot and the characters are strong and likable. I love that the book is really entirely centered on family and friendship, which is unique for a YA novel, because most that claim that tend to end up being more about romantic love. It felt like I was missing the second layer of what I love to find in books- I understood the characters' pain and love, but I didn't feel it myself. All around, I'd say a solid 3-3.5/5.

The first about 100 pages I didn't really care but by the end it had made me cry a good ten times and I fell in love with all the characters. His writing is just as beautiful as in ari and dante (book by him also if that wasn't clear), no major romantic plot line which was amazing, really interesting perspectives and storylines. highly highly recommend sticking with it.

I was very entertained by this book, from start to finish. The characters are very lovable, the writing is witty and creative. There are many stories being told within this novel, and many of them pull the heartstrings :)
