

Peacemaking Women: Biblical Hope For Resolving Conflict



Synopsis

Women have a strong desire for relational connections. Relationships between women can be especially enriching, but when conflict arises, they also can be especially damaging. Too many women approach conflict as if they were unbelievers with gossip, spiteful actions, bitterness, and even hatred. In *Peacemaking Women*, Tara Klena Barthel and Judy Dabler offer a meaningful, lasting message to lead women out of conflict to a state of peace where they can live as representatives of Christ to one another and well as unbelievers. With advice that is firmly rooted in Scripture, the authors bring sound, practical help for women who want to know what the Bible says about conflict resolution and how to achieve peace in their relationships with God, self, and others.

As professional Christian conciliators, Barthel and Dabler have seen individuals struggle with addiction, friendship and sexual sin; they've seen churches on the verge of schism, looming lawsuits and businesses gone awry. Now they apply principles of reconciliation and peace specifically to women because "many Christian women today are not at peace." They urge women to become "true peacemakers through repentance, faith, and rightful worship of God alone." Readers will find information on resolving conflicts with God first, then others, then themselves. The authors address the areas of marriage, family and the church, as well as conflicts arising from idolatry, suffering, shame, depression and fear. They use the Bible as the authority on resolving conflict, offering broad biblical concepts in place of how-to lists and step-by-step instruction. Each chapter includes questions for reflection and a resource list, and real-life examples appear

throughout, including the authors' own conflicts in writing the book. It is, however, a long-winded, back-door approach to the subject that seems to struggle with what it really is: a book about conflict resolution or a book about taking that resolution one step further to become proactive, peace-making women. There is plenty of good information about conflict, and a sound biblical foundation, but not enough specifics on how women can live in peace day by day. As a book-loving Christian for all of my adult life, I have sought wisdom from the Bible as my main resource. I've also looked for wisdom from Christian writers. With a few notable exceptions (Elisabeth Elliot, Joni Tada, Margaret Clarkson, Edith Schaeffer), it seems that the majority of books written for Christian women is like cotton candy -- cute to look at, fun, but no real nourishment. Then I was told about "Peacemaking Women". What a smorgasbord of insight, wisdom and life-changing truths I've encountered in this book! The authors (Tara Barthel and Judy Dabler) have caused me to examine the depth and reality of my Christian faith...am I just playing games or do I really want to promote the Gospel through my changed life? The book is divided into three sections: Conflicts with God, Conflicts with Others and Conflicts Within. The chapter on idolatry (Chap. 2) is worth the price of the book alone. I am challenged through this book to unflinchingly test my attitudes, my words and my actions against the truth of the Word of God. It has been a humbling and yet encouraging process to go through this book and shine the light of truth onto my much-loved besetting sins. Real

growth is possible for the serious Christian and this book offers plenty of food for thought. Highly recommended.

The authors include helpful resources and questions for further thought at the end of each chapter. I've used this book in a small group study, and it works well that way. It offers helpful information and encouragement for married women, single women, older women, young women, mature believers, and new believers.

I read this book and liked it so much that I told my friend about it. She read it and bought about 25 copies to give to all the women in her life who needed to hear the message in this book. Then we started an online book club to share what we were learning. We had about 45 women from Nicaragua to California to Connecticut and everywhere in between sharing how this book taught us, encouraged us, and convicted us to live out the gospel - in both grace and truth - in our daily lives. I especially love the discussion of shalom (three parts: peace with God, peace with others, and peace within - and you can't have one without the others). What a great book. Can't recommend it highly enough!
