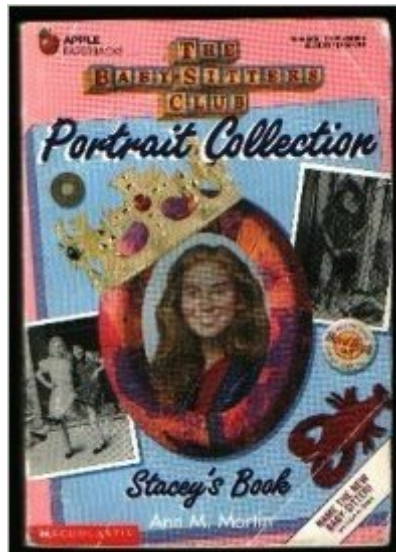




The book was found

The Babysitters Club books are always an interesting read. The stories are well put together. I really like the portrait books because they give you a look into the early lives of the BSC members. I only wish there had been portrait books for Jessi & Mallory. It was interesting reading about Stacey's experiences growing up in New York City.

As part of an eighth-grade assignment, 13-year-old Stacey McGill chronicles twelve of her years growing up in New York City, starting with her birth, and including such events as her first day at kindergarten, where she makes friends with Laine Cummings, her best friend for several years (until she meets Claudia Kishi); being in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade with Cinderella, her idol when she was five years old; ditching ballroom dance lessons with Laine at age eight, which gets them both in trouble; and vacationing with her parents for two weeks on a secluded island in Maine, where a 10-year-old culture-shocked Stacey reluctantly befriends the only other kid on Pine Island. Overall, this was a great first-person look at Stacey's life before she moved to Stoneybrook. However, there is quite a gap from when she lived in Stoneybrook to the point when she returned to

NYC; so don't expect a very complete autobiography--it just covers the years that she was in NYC, prior to the Baby-sitters Club series starting. Still, fans of this series--and especially of Stacey--should like "Stacey's Book."

can you believe it? Everyone at SMS has to write an autobiography. So Stacey been looking through photo albums and trying to remember the past-the good and the bad. Like when she was 5 and got to be in Macy's Thanksgiving Parade. And When she was 8 and Laine and she got in trouble. She has been writing about her diabetes, before the divorce, and even Stoneybrooke and the BSC. In fact, everything right up until this minute So this is her life-WELCOME TO IT!

This was a good book but it left a lot of things unexplained... First of all, it DOES NOT tell about what must be an important (though maybe not exciting) part of her life when she found out she had diabetes--they skipped it entirely! And it keeps refering to Laine as her ex-best friend, but it really doesn't say WHY they aren't friends anymore. And at the end Claudia comes to visit in New York. They put a LOT of detail into that. No offense to the author, but the part about Claudia spoiling half the weekend because she thought Stacey didn't want to be her friend anymore? It was not exactly brilliant. And it's a little hard to follow why she and Mara (on the island) were so rude and cold to each other. But it's easy to know what Stacey is feeling when her parents decide to spend two weeks on a tiny island and be cut off from the mainland entirely. (And about ballroom dancing and the 'sweaty-palm waltz'.) I had mixed feelings about this book, but I do agree that if you're a Stacey fan you should read this book.
