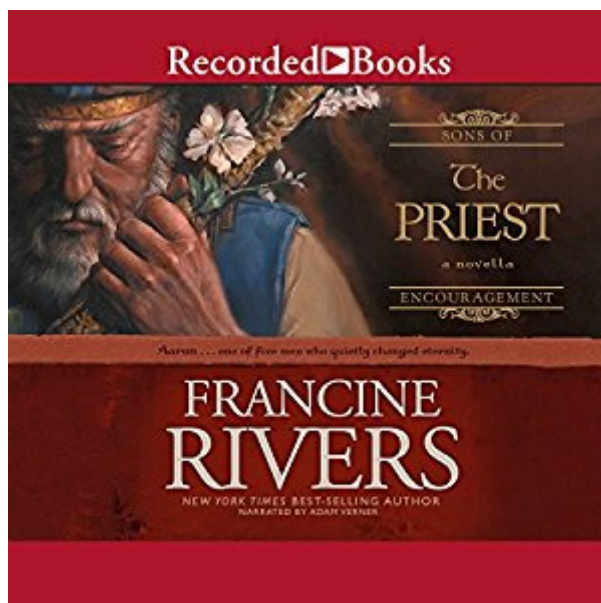

Regrettably, this novella offered no new insight into Aaron's life as a priest. Most of the book is predictable. A plus is that it sticks close to Scripture. Aaron was depicted as a tired, confused and wanting old man. I was hoping the author gave him energy and a dynamic personality. But she did not. It is still an okay book to read but the pace is deadly slow at times. Too much narration of Aaron's inner thoughts. I was hoping to see how he interacted with the people through dialogue. Aaron appears to be a tag along who believes God thinks lesser of him than he does of Moses. As God's chosen priest, I believe the author could have injected more life into this character and also gave him a family life. It seemed Aaron was around people, but never with people.

While beginning this book I felt like I was reading scripture. As historical fiction I was expecting more detailed description. Sometimes I felt like I was left hanging. But toward the middle/end I was caught up in the book especially when reading about the shekinah glory of the Lord in the cloud.

This book deepens your understanding of Moses and Aaron. Francine Rivers made me understand

the struggles these two amazing men of God went through and how God used them in ways I had not recognized before.

This novella, by Francine Rivers is the best account (other than the Bible!) of the Exodus of Egypt. She brings to life the trials and tribulations, squawking and squalling people that made up the Hebrew Nation at a time when their lives were in utter turmoil. Aaron at first comes across as the little brother who never got his way, and ends up as the encourager to Moses and the Hebrew people. I thoroughly enjoyed this book and could not put it down. The Bible study that accompanies this is also an excellent tool to use for groups.

This book follows so closely along with the Book of Moses so that if you have read it then it is sort of repetitive.
