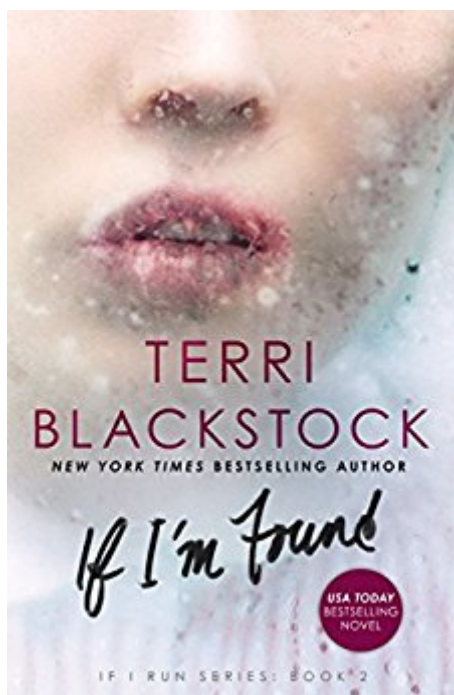


The book was found

If you haven't read *If I Run*, that's okay, but you would lose a little bit of the story and some parts of this book wouldn't make sense. I like books that run in a trilogy where book two picks up where book one left off, and book three picks up immediately after two. (Waiting patiently for book three). Terri Blackstock delivers another wonderful story that kept me reading into the early morning hours and turning the pages to see what would happen. With *If I'm Found*, the small story plot that Casey finds herself involved in isn't as intimate as the previous book. She is more of that outside observer who makes a difference through secondary resources. Again, I am enjoying a character who is feminine and yet not helpless. Casey Cox is portrayed as a strong Southern woman who doesn't cower before an adversary. I can't help but feel my heart speed up with every close call. Dylan is a man I'm beginning to admire greatly. His own shortcomings make me more human and real to me. He isn't this chiseled, perfect specimen swooping in to save the damsel. He's a man of God determined to bring justice to the wrongs committed. Terri Blackstock also portrays the mind of a soulless man well without giving in to compromise and using vulgar or coarse language. This heightens the tension of the story and gives it an elevation that made me read faster and spurred me on this suspenseful journey. *If I'm Found* superseded *If I Run*. And I'm extremely excited, but still willing to be patient, to read the next installment and see how the story will conclude. As always, another great book by a truly wonderful author.

As in the first book of this series, Casey's running for her life. She's wanted for the murder of her close friend, a murder committed by a few crooked police officers. Dylan has been hired by his best friend's parents to find Casey. They want her prosecuted for murdering their son. When Casey runs to Dallas, she tries to save a man who's been accused of molesting a child and tries to save that child from her true molester. Why would a killer get involved in others' lives, putting herself in danger? Can Dylan convince Casey that he believes she's innocent? It's a race against time to collect enough evidence to expose the evil police officers. Dylan's relieved when Casey can finally see how God has been protecting her through all of this. You won't be able to put this book down if you enjoy suspense and romance! I'm looking forward to the last book in this series, but sorry that it'll be another year!

Terri Blackstock is a favorite with my book club. We've yet to meet a book she has written that we didn't like. *If I'm Found*, book 2 in the *If I Run* series, received a unanimous thumbs up from us. The novel is action-packed with the ongoing story

of Casey's quest to clear her name and the additional story line of a man wrongfully accused of child abuse. As with the first book, there are some loose ends left at the end, and we are eagerly anticipating book 3, *If I Live*. Most of our discussion revolved around Casey's motivations • her need to find the truth and her innate sense of right and wrong. Casey is beginning to respond to God's promptings, and we found that intriguing as well. While *If I'm Found* is adrenaline-laced suspense, the character development is well done. We loved the good guys, Dylan especially, and hated the bad guys. Because this one is the middle offering in a trilogy, there is still plenty of what-ifs. We had fun coming up with scenarios for the last book. It will be interesting to see if any of our theories come true. For fans of *Blackstock*, *If I'm Found* is another winner. If I'm Found is the heart-pounding sequel to Terri Blackstock's *If I Run*. The tension and suspense continue to grow in this second book of the series. The characters are fascinating and complex. Casey Cox is on the run for her life but just can't keep from caring for and helping others in dire situations, no matter the personal risk. Dylan Roberts is pursuing her but is caught in between threatening members of the law enforcement community and what he believes to be true about Casey. Trying to reconcile danger and truth leads to a multitude of life and death situations. Woven throughout the story are important elements of faith and learning to trust God, no matter what. As an additional perk, I love what is being done with the covers of the books in this series. I'm not always impacted by book covers, but the creativity with this set is awesome. I highly recommend *If I'm Found* to fans of great suspense. This series is one of Terri's best! You will definitely want to start with the first book, *If I Run*. The only bad thing about the series -- the conclusion will not be out until next spring. What a wait!
