

In an easy, open style and spacious design with lots of black-and-white photos, this history celebrates the role of Jews in the U.S., their personal stories and national influence in helping to define American culture. From the beginning, Finkelstein relates the particulars of the Jewish experience to the universals of immigration, especially the struggle between assimilation and identity across generations. Short profiles of the famous--from Emma Goldman to Irving Berlin and Joseph Lieberman--are woven into the narrative. Finklestein doesn't ignore the negatives: there are harrowing accounts of anti-Semitism, including diatribes from Henry Ford and Charles Lindbergh, and a section about the lynching of Leo Frank, as well as stories of Jews who denied their own identity so as "not to draw attention." Of course, everyone will find something to argue with here, but
